Extra Teaching Points Chapter 9 Matt. 6:1-18

There are 3 practices here that Jesus talks about.

- Charitable deeds (vs. 1-4)
- Praying (vs. 5-7)
- Fasting (vs. 16-18)

It is clear that He says we are not to do them to draw attention to ourselves.

- Jesus uses a similar approach to the one He used in Matt. 5.
 - In <u>Matt. 5</u> Jesus repeated the phrase: "You've heard it said _____, but I say ____."
 - In <u>Matt. 6</u> Jesus repeats the phrase: "When you do _____, do not do it like the hypocrites; for they do it in _____ way to be seen by men. But when you do _____, you do it in _____ way, and you will be rewarded by your Father in heaven."

In each case, He says the hypocrites already have their reward.

<u>Matt. 6:1</u>

Jesus starts this section with a warning He doesn't use very often. He tells us to "Beware" or "Be careful" or "take heed."

- He uses this warning here in:
 - o Matt. 7:15 False prophets
 - Matt. 10:17 Men who will hand you over
 - <u>Matt. 16:6</u> Leaven of the Pharisees & Sadducees
 - Matt. 16:11 Leaven of the Pharisees & Sadducees
 - o <u>Luke 12:1</u> Leaven of the Pharisees which is hypocrisy
 - \circ <u>Luke 17:3</u> Giving-in to being offended
 - o Luke 20:46 Scribes
 - o Luke 21:34 Weighed down heart
 - o <u>Mark 8:15</u> Leaven of the Pharisees & Leaven of Herod

"Beware the Leaven"

Leaven (or yeast) is something that works silently. It will take over and change the entire lump of dough.

• Jesus also compared the Kingdom to leaven (<u>Matt 13:33</u>).

Jesus only combined the warning to "beware" and "leaven" in reference to three groups of people.

- In <u>Luke 12:1</u> Jesus said to beware the leaven of the Pharisees, which is **hypocrisy**.
- In <u>Mark 8:15</u> Jesus warned of the leaven of Herod.
 - The leaven of Herod is most likely **procrastination**.
 - Herod liked talking to John the Baptist (<u>Mark 6:20</u>), but never responded.
 - Eventually he had to kill John (Mark 6:26-28).
- In <u>Matt. 16:6-12</u> Jesus warned against the leaven of the Pharisees and Sadducees.
 - The leaven of the Sadducees was **worldliness**.
 - (*From Unger's Bible Dictionary*) Josephus repeatedly designates them as those who gain only the rich, and have not the people on their side (*Ant.* 13.10.6).
 - What Josephus really means is that the Sadducees were the aristocrats, the wealthy, and the persons of rank from the *priesthood*.

- <u>Acts 5:17</u> and Josephus (*Ant.* 20.9.1) testifies that the high-priestly families belonged to the Sadducee party.
 - The Sadducees were not, however, merely the priestly party but **aristocratic priests**.

We are to be on our guard, and alert to these influences that can spread rapidly in the church!

Q: Why doesn't Jesus warn us the same way about murder, drunkenness, or blasphemy?

- People can spot those kinds of sins fairly easily; but hypocrisy, procrastination, and worldliness can sneak in and mask themselves in religion.
- His call to "beware" certain sins is because of their ability to sneak up and hide in plain sight.

Q: Jesus warns us to "beware of practicing our righteousness before men." In <u>Matt. 5:16</u> Jesus told us to let our light shine before men. Is there a contradiction here?

- No! Jesus is talking about motive.
- Jesus is drawing a difference between wanting to be righteous before the Lord, and wanting to be seen as righteous before men.

<u> Matt. 6:2</u>

In Jesus' day, being called a hypocrite wasn't an insult like it is today.

- A hypocrite was an actor; that's what the word meant.
- But the context of calling a religious person an actor was definitely an insult.
 - Jesus was appealing to the motives behind why people do even <u>good</u> things.

<u> Matt. 6:3</u>

When we do righteous acts we can sometimes be praised and noticed for it.

- There can be a temptation to enjoy that praise and attention, and thus begin to seek it.
 - We can be very easily deceived into thinking we do what we do for God's reward only, and in reality be craving people noticing and praising us.
- There is a real danger of Christians being more righteous when there is a likelihood of people finding out and respecting them for it.
 - If you do things so people will notice, then their noticing is the only reward you will receive!
 - If you are motivated to do something by your love of God, and your desire to please Him... He will reward that!

- Q: How are you guarding yourself against the Leaven of Herod (Procrastination)?
