# The Day Everything Changed Study #3

- Q: Why did Jesus have to die for us?
- Q: How is the world different because of the cross?
- Q: What did Jesus' crucifixion do for you?

#### Read John 12:27-33

"Now is my soul troubled. And what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But **for this purpose I have come to this hour**. ... <sup>31</sup> Now is the judgment of this world; **now will the ruler of this world be cast out**. <sup>32</sup> And I, **when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.**" <sup>33</sup> He said this to show by what kind of death he was going to die." (ESV)

#### Q #1: Why did King Jesus have to die?

• Lev. 17:11; Rom. 5:12; Heb. 9:13-14; 1John 3:5; John 1:29; Heb. 9:26

#### Read John 19:17-30

"So they took Jesus, <sup>17</sup> and he went out, bearing his own cross, to the place called **The Place of a Skull**, which in Aramaic is called Golgotha. <sup>18</sup> There they crucified him... <sup>30</sup> When Jesus had received the sour wine, he said, "It is finished," and he bowed his head and gave up his spirit." (ESV)

#### Q #2: What did Jesus mean when He said, "It is finished"?

• John 17:4-5; Acts 13:29; Gen. 3:15

#### Read Col. 2:15

"And having disarmed the powers and authorities, he made **a public spectacle** of them, **triumphing over them by the cross**." (NIV)

#### Q #3: Who are the "powers and authorities" Paul is talking about here?

• Col. 1:12b-14; Eph. 6:12; Rom. 5:14; 21

#### Read 1Peter 2:24

"He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we **might die to sin and live to righteousness**. By his wounds you have been healed." (ESV)

#### Q #4: What did Jesus' Crucifixion do for you?

#### **TRUTH TO REMEMBER:** Because of the cross, nothing can keep you from God!

The crucifixion of Jesus only means what it means because of the resurrection. Jesus didn't just die to pay the debt of sin - God raised Him back to life! In our next study, we will look at the resurrection and what it means for us!

# Notes:

## Q #1: Why did King Jesus have to die?

- God had always required blood to cover over the sin of His people.
  - Life is in the blood (Lev. 17:11) and to come into God's presence people had to cover the death and decay of sin (Rom 5:12) with life.
  - However, the blood of animal sacrifice couldn't take away sin completely (Heb. 9:13-14).
- Jesus was the only one qualified to be a perfect sacrifice. Because He is the sinless "Lamb of God" (1John 3:5) He was the only one who could take away the sin of the world (John 1:29).
  - Jesus "appeared once for all at the culmination of the ages to do away with sin by the sacrifice of himself" (Heb. 9:26).

## Q #2: What did it mean when Jesus said, "It is finished"?

- The story of God's original creation began in a beautiful garden with the first Adam eating from the tree of life, and it ended in a place of death so ugly it was called "the Place of a Skull"!
- Jesus had finished the work God had given Him to do (John 17:4-5) which included fulfilling all the prophecies about Him (Acts 13:29).
  - The most important prophecy Jesus fulfilled was the first prophecy about Him. God said He would crush Satan's head (Gen. 3:15) and He did, which finished the story of God's original creation.

# Q #3: Who are the "powers and authorities" Paul is talking about?

• Paul is talking about the Dominion of Darkness which he mentioned one chapter earlier in **Col. 1:12b-14**. He also mentions them in **Eph. 6:12**.

King Jesus defeated the Dominion of Darkness by dying a sacrificial death on the cross. As a result, the world is now a VERY DIFFERENT place to live.

Sin no longer reigns, Grace reigns!!! (Rom. 5:14; 21)

# Q #4: What did Jesus' Crucifixion do for you?

- "To die to something" is a metaphorical way of expressing deliverance from its power and dominion.
  - $\circ$   $\;$  To die to sin is to be free from its power, including the desire to perform it.
- Because of Jesus' sacrifice on the cross:
  - "we might die to sin and live to righteousness." That means you can choose!
  - You can save yourself from *"this corrupt generation"* (Acts 2:40) and *"the present form of this world"* which is *"passing away"* (1Cor. 7:31).
