Directions

The camp is located 7 miles east of Rolla Missouri. From I-44 take exit 189 (State Rd V) and take the outer service road on the North side of the interstate heading east towards St. James Missouri. From the outer road you will see a brown wooden sign for Little Prairie Lake. Turn at State road RA. Just past the entrance to Little Prairie Lake turn right on County Rd. 40. Follow this to an intersection and the main gate to the camp will be straight ahead.





About Little Prairie Bible Camp...

LPBC is a non-profit corporation composed of Christians who are interested in spiritual growth through Christian camping. Located five miles northwest of Rolla, Missouri, LPBC is an area-wide Christian Camp which is available for use by all Christians in central Missouri. Although membership in LPBC is not a requirement in order to use the camp, membership helps support the Camp and entitles the member to have a voice in how the Camp is run and what facilities will be built.

LPBC is not under the oversight of any specific congregation of the Church of Christ, but rather is governed by a board of 12 Directors who are elected in two year terms by the members of LPBC. Election of officers and voting on other members of LPBC.

Election of officers and voting on other motions which affect LPBC is done at the annual meeting of the membership of LPBC on the first Saturday in October.

The primary and narrowed purpose of LPBC is to influence others for Christ and to draw everyone who goes there closer to Jesus and to each other. This is accomplished through Bible study, devotionals, worshipping together, singing, praying, and eating together...playing and sharing together.

The camp exists to provide a retreat for young and old alike; a place to reflect and "get it all together" so all can go forth to win souls and live for Christ. The Board of LPBC recognizes that Christian camping is conducive to Christian growth. With this in mind, plans were made in the very beginning to use LPBC for summer camp for young people, as well as for all kinds of workshops, retreats, training, sessions, planning sessions devotionals, youth forums, singings, and camping.

LPBC carries secondary insurance to that covers accidents or injury only <u>for the amount</u> <u>the Family medical insurance will not cover</u>. In case of emergencies, campers are taken to Phelps Health in Rolla.

Summer Camp At LPBC

Camp Activities are directed toward spiritual and social growth of our young people. They include Bible classes, devotionals, lots of singing, cookouts, segregated swimming, horseshoes, volleyball, slip in slides, basketball, softball, ping pong, arts and crafts, skits, hiking, special activity nights, guest speakers, Christian counseling and worship services.

Camping sessions during the summer are limited to a total of 100 people, which includes the campers, directors, and staff. There are now 11 cabins and a directors cabin located in the heart of a pine forest. In addition, a chapel and devotional area have been added, a nature trail was built by the Senior week boys in 1999 and 2000, and in 2001 a craft facility was completed. A new girls cabin was added in May of 2017. Boy's cabin 4 was remodeled as well! And a new swimming pool has been built in 2018

All bible camp personnel are volunteers and are members of the Church of Christ. They are carefully selected individually, under the oversight of the Board of Directors. Children from all backgrounds are welcome to attend LPBC.

A qualified camp nurse is on duty each camping session. Swimming is closely supervised by a male life guard for the boys, and a female life guard for the girls.

What kind of things should I bring to camp?

Here's a list

Clearly label all your items in case your child misplaces or loses them. Primary Week campers are notorious for losing/misplacing their items. Labeling their clothing, bedding, etc helps counselors make sure everything campers bring to camp gets back home.

Here's a list of things <u>not</u> to bring:

- Electronics: CD player, Cell phone,
- Fishing equipment.
- Fireworks.
- Pocket knives
- No pets...unless it's a Pillow Pet.

If you have medication, you must inform the camp nurse. She will remind you each day of dosage.

Please be at the camp on Friday (June 21) by 4pm. If possible, leave with your child after the evening program.
